Articles of Incorporation

OF

Columbus Section of the American Chemical Society
(Name of Corporation)

The undersigned, desiring to form a corporation, not for profit, under Sections 1702.01 et seq., Revised Code of Ohio, do hereby certify:

FIRST. The name of said corporation shall be Columbus Section of the American Chemical Society

SECOND. The place in Ohio where the principal office of the corporation is to be located is Columbus, Franklin County.
(City, Village or Township)

THIRD. The purpose or purposes for which said corporation is formed are:

To be a non-profit corporation organized exclusively for scientific purposes, specifically to encourage in the broadest manner the advancement of chemistry; to promote research in chemical science; to improve the qualifications and usefulness of chemists and chemical engineers through high standards of professional ethics and education; to increase and disseminate chemical knowledge; and by its meetings, professional associations, reports, papers, discussions, and publications, to promote scientific interests and inquiry, thereby fostering public welfare and education.

Anything to the contrary notwithstanding, the purpose or purposes for which this corporation is organized are limited to such as will qualify it as an exempt organization under Internal Revenue Code, Section 501 subd (c) (3), including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to other organizations that so qualify. This corporation shall not, as a substantial part of its activities, carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation; nor shall it participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. No part of the net earnings, properties, or assets of this corporation, on dissolution or otherwise, shall inure to the benefit of any private person or individual or any member, officer or trustee of this corporation, and on liquidation or dissolution all properties and assets of this corporation remaining after paying or providing for all debts and obligations shall be distributed and paid over to such fund, foundation, or corporation organized and operated for charitable purposes as the board of trustees shall determine, and as shall at the time qualify as a tax-exempt organization under Internal Revenue Code Section 501 subd (c) (3), or as the same may be amended.

FOURTH: The corporation shall be subordinate to and subject to the authority of the Charter, Constitution, and Bylaws of the

American Chemical Society, Washington, D.C.


FIFTH: Columbus Section of the American Chemical Society, a previously unincorporated association, acting under authority of its Bylaws and Section 1702.08 of the Revised Code, by a two-thirds vote of those votes cast in a duly authorized mail ballot, the results of which were certified by said association's Committee of Tellers on November 15, 1982, did authorize the incorporation of said association.

SIXTH: Unless the Regulations of the corporation otherwise specify, the trustees of the corporation shall be the three Councilors of Columbus Section of the American Chemical Society having the longest remaining terms of office; the Chairman of Columbus Section of the American Chemical Society shall specify the order in which terms of office expire for Councilors having terms of office which expire on the same day.

SEVENTH: The following persons, who are the Councilors of Columbus Section of the American Chemical Society having the longest remaining terms of office, shall serve the corporation as initial trustees.

- 2) The statutory agent for a corporation may be (a) a natural person who is a resident of Ohio, or (b) an Ohio corporation or a foreign corporation licensed in Ohio which has a business address in this state and is explicitly authorized by its articles of incorporation to act as a statutory agent. R.C. 1701.07(A), 1702.06(A).
- 3) The agent's complete street address must be given; a post office box number is not acceptable. R.C. 1701.07(C), 1702.06(C).
- 4) An original appointment of agent form must be signed by at least a majority of the incorporators of the corporation. R.C. 1701.07(B), 1702.06(B).
